

Spring Annual Fund Appeal

Many of you know that as a non-municipal Library, the AFL receives only partial support from the State and Town. We work with RI library organizations to lobby the State to increase library support at least to the percentage required by law. The Town of Hopkinton generally gives its libraries a small increase every three years or so. As of this newsletter date, however, the Town's small increase has been reduced to way less than 1% of our budget. Meanwhile, the cost of utilities, building maintenance and supplies is ever increasing. Your annual spring request for support will soon arrive in your mailbox. Please consider increasing your contribution this year to help us bridge the 20% gap in our operating budget. If you're not on our mailing list, envelopes for support will be available at the circulation desk.
